Santa Parade: How wonderful to see so many of our tamariki in the Santa Parade on Saturday representing all sorts of different groups, agencies and activities that are available in Southland. Room 10 were especially fortunate to accompany the More FM Team on the 'UP' themed float with Steve, Simon, Corbyn and Nick who are all heard on the radio. The radio team were very impressed with the children, their behaviour, manners, questions and fun that they had throughout the parade.

<u>Swimming:</u> Once again our values have been on display for the public to see with the second half of the school taking their swimming lessons. It is fabulous having our senior students step up and support our junior children with swimming and our Year 5s have certainly been doing that for the past week, following the excellent example the Year 6s set the two weeks previous. We have had a number of community members comment positively on the behaviour and manners of the tamariki at the pool. Well done to everyone for remembering the expectations at the pool and also when on the buses. The swimming progress has also been fabulous with the consistency of the 10 sessions in a row.

<u>Sunhats:</u> Term four is the term where sunhats are everyday uniform items. The children should have these packed in their school bags every day ready for wearing. A bucket hat is the uniform, please no caps. With the weather being interchangeable, one day brilliant sunshine and then drizzle and rain for part of the next it is important that potae (hats) are at school everyday. Children who do not have a sunhat are restricted to playing in the shade of the trees in front of the staffroom area on days when they are needed.

<u>Mufti Day:</u> This <u>Rāmere 1st Hakihea</u> (<u>Friday 1st December</u>) we are having a mufti day to raise money for Chatbus. This service is well used by children across all levels at Salford School so we look forward to seeing how much we can raise to support its continuance. Children can wear whatever clothing they wish for the day and bring a donation to contribute to The Chatbus Fundraiser. Teachers will collect the money in class in the morning.

<u>Pack the bus:</u> Next <u>Rāpare 7th Hakihea (Thursday 7th December)</u> More FM are holding their annual Pack the Bus run. We ask everyone to contribute to this by bringing along a non perishable item (or two) to load onto the bus. Each ruma gets to walk through the bus for the tamariki to place their items into the boxes on board themselves.

The Kapahaka will also be performing for the More FM Team during their stop at Salford School so keep an eye on their facebook page or an ear on the radio to hear them perform.

End of Year Events:

<u>Final Values Assembly</u> - On Rātu 12th Hakihea (Tuesday 12th December) we will be having our final values assembly for 2023. This is where we recognise and celebrate tamariki who have consistently demonstrated the school values throughout the whole year or who have shown real growth and learning in one particular value. This assembly will begin at 1:30 in the hall.

<u>Year 6 Leavers</u> - Rāpa 13th Hakihea (Wednesday 13th December) we have our Year 6 leavers assembly. We have a large group of 51 Year 6 ākonga this year so we will be beginning this assembly at 1:15 to ensure we can celebrate them fully.

<u>Carols Night</u> - This will be taking place on Rāpa 13th Hakihea (Wednesday 13th December). You can bring a picnic dinner from 5:30pm onwards. Flying Wasabi can be preordered, Rad Dad will also be there with burgers for sale along with coffee cars and the shake van. The kapahaka will open the entertainment around 5:45pm.

At the Carols night there will be tables set up in the hall for you to have your say on the Salford School Strategic Plan for 2024 - 2025. This is a document created by the Board of Trustees based on community surveys, ākonga and staff voice over the past 3 years looking at the direction of growth, priorities for learners and professional learning for staff at Salford School for the next two years. We look forward to hearing your thoughts, suggestions and ideas about the Strategic Plan.

<u>Last day of Term</u> - the last day of term four and the 2023 school year is Rāpare 14th Hakihea (Thursday 14th December). School will finish at 12:30 with all children needing to be picked up at this time. If your child is to walk home at this time please let their classroom teacher know. The day is a messy one with cleaning, furniture moving and generally making sure the school is all set for a rest over the break. There are also a lot of games and activities to be had and, weather permitting, the slip and slides. (Children wishing to take part in the slip and slides need to bring a change of clothes to school.)

As we approach the end of the year candy canes and other Christmas goodies and treats are often handed out by children to their friends. We ask that these are given to teachers first thing in the morning to hand out at the end of the day. All sweets are expected to be taken home for whānau to determine when they are eaten. Often we have children eating candy canes and other treats first thing in the morning when they are handed out by the children. This is not helpful during classroom time for learning and also does not support individual whānau values around treat foods.
