Tumuaki Note: Kia ora Salford Whānau, BACK TO SCHOOL

Welcome to 2024 and another exciting year of learning, challenges, community and celebration. We had a great start to the year although there were a few tired faces on Friday after 4 days of being back into routine (not just the tamariki either). It has been lovely catching up with everyone after the holiday break and hearing about everyone's adventures. The Year 3s are also very excited about now being allowed on the 'big kids' playground - a huge rite of passage at Salford School and the Year 5 and 6 tamariki are looking forward to their growing leadership opportunities.

This year we welcome Mrs Chantelle Gibbs (teaching in Room 8) and Miss Duanette Ineson (teaching in Room 4) to the team. We also have Patty Hartley (one of our fabulous Kaiāwhina kaiako) working in the office in the mornings from 9 - 10 to help you with all of those before school bits and pieces.

We also welcome Mrs Tegan Wells back from maternity leave. She is teaching in Room 3 Monday through to Thursday with Mrs Rutledge teaching on Fridays.

We also have a number of new tamariki and their whānau who have joined the Salford Community. Welcome to Ambrose, Bodhi, Brooklyn, Ciara, Eddrian, Eleanor, Elliana, Freya, Iris, Jack Jensen, Jhanvi, Malin, Ranuli, Summer, Ria, Malin, and Tinedhi, we look forward to getting to know you all and working with you at Salford School.

The staff started the year with two Teacher Only Days. The first day was spent exploring what it means by Mental Health lead by our Mitey facilitator Belinda Brown. Belinda will be working with the kaiako, wider school staff and tamariki throughout the next two years as we introduce and develop the Mitey Programme focusing on Mental Health at Salford School. This programme supports, complements and extends our PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) mahi.

Our second Teacher Only Day was spent on first aid training. All teachers are first aide certificated (for the majority this session was a first aide refresh) and most of our teacher aides are as well. This adds to the level of support the staff can provide to each other and the tamariki in times of injury or medical need.

We trust all of our 2023 Year 6 ākonga have had a positive start to their start at secondary school. We were given a lovely gift at the end of 2023 from the Fleming Family which you will see hanging in the office in the near future. Callum was the last of the Fleming family to come through Salford School and he finished Year 6 at the end of 2023. The framed print from the family is to acknowledge their 12 years of involvement with Salford School. We look forward to having this reminder of whānau involvement.

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Meet the Teacher:

It was lovely to have so many of you able to pop in to 'Meet the Teacher' the week before school started. We trust it helped relieve some of those school starting nerves - it did for the kaiako! We look forward to making this an annual event to support with ensuring positive starts to the year.

Strategic Planning:

If you have any feedback, ideas for the 2024 - 2025 school strategic plan we would love to hear them. A number of these were handed out at the Meet the Teacher Afternoon. Copies have been blue tacked onto a number of windows around the school as well. There is a box with copies of the plan just inside the office as well. At Salford School we work hard to provide a range of opportunities for our tamariki to shine, both in the classroom and beyond. At times we need whānau support to have these things happen, we look forward to working with you to provide as many opportunities as possible throughout the year. If you are interested in taking teams for sports or other activities with your own skills and knowledge please let us know. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Kapahaka:

This week we will be starting Kapahaka for 2024. This will take place on Thursday afternoons from 1:30 - 2:30pm. All tamariki are welcome to take part in Kapahaka. We had over 80 ākonga take part last year which is fantastic. We are fortunate to have Whaea Sharleen supporting the ropū but if there are other whānau members who are keen and experienced with Kapahaka and Te Ao Māori we would love your support too. We also would love a guitarist to assist, if anyone is able and skilled in this area. Please contact Sarah Gibbs (sarahg@salford.school.nz) if you are able to assist at all.



Each class has enjoyed having their Life Education sessions with Teresa and Harold. Every class has two sessions over the week that they are here at school. This year the focus has been on Food and Nutrition, fueling our brains and bodies properly so that the tamariki can learn and play to their optimum. Having a well balanced lunchbox is important for the tamariki to get through a busy day of learning and play at school. If their brains and bodies are not fueled correctly then energy disappears, concentration waivers, focus declines, behaviour can be affected as the focus on hunger or affects of certain foods kick in resulting in a challenging day. Hydration is also a part of fueling our brains and bodies well.

We are a nut free school at Salford School and a water only school. Children do not need any other liquid beyond water in their drink bottles each day. Lollies and other such treats are also not to be eaten during the school day. (Any such treats that may be brought in for special events etc are expected to be taken home at the end of the day for whānau to distribute as per their family values and expectations).

REMINDER—Term 1 is a Sun Hat term as per school Policy.

Just a reminder that sun hats are a necessary uniform item for terms one and four at Salford School.

It has been fabulous to see so many children with their hats daily (even though the weather has been very intermittent with the sunshine). There have been some lovely buttons and ribbons attached to hats for easy identification as well. Tu meke whānau for doing this and helping us to keep the children safe from the damage sun can cause.

Yes they are all Navy, look the same, hard to label—there is a lot less loss by those families who are when purchasing spending \$5.00 more and getting the name embroidered on the front. Easily returned to the owner. Help us to help you.



It is always a tricky task balancing staffing with school enrolments. Having as much notice as possible for incoming enrolments helps us to ensure space, staff and resources are appropriately set and allocated in a timely manner.

We ask that if you have anyone starting school within the next 18 - 24 months or have friends who have tamariki they are intending on enrolling at Salford School in that time, that they enrol them now. This may seem early but for school planning and organisation we need this information at least a year out from the tamariki starting. This also helps us to calculate how many Out of Zone Enrolment spaces we may have available for our ballots that are held twice a year.

Our first ballot for Out Of Zone enrolments will take place in the first days of March. If you know of anyone out of the Salford School zone interested in having their tamariki come to Salford School please encourage them to get their enrolment forms in to be considered. We have limited spaces in certain year levels available.

The next Out of Zone ballot after the one in **March** is in the first days of October.

Afterschool Care:

If your child attends Enrich at any time please note that any changes to bookings (additions or withdrawals) need to be made no later than **1:30pm** on the day of the booking.

This allows us time to arrange additional staffing should it be required or reduce staffing if it is not required. Thank you for assisting us in keeping your children safe and After School Care appropriately staffed through early and clear communication.



Reminder of After School Care charges:

The After School Care rates are—incl GST

- 1 child = \$8.05 per hour
- 2 children = **\$13.80** per hour
- 3 children = **\$19.55** per hour
- 4 children = by arrangement
- Non-attendance/cancellation fee= \$17.25 (this will be applied for a non/late-cancellation)
- Late pick up fee = \$17.25 (After 5:30pm)

Making a New or Cancelling a Booking:

Parents can make or cancel bookings in one of the following ways before **1:30pm**:

Note the cellphone will not be answered during the school day but you can leave a message.

If a cancellation is **not** made on the day the child is to attend by **1:30pm**, the full cancellation / non-attendance fee will be charged. (Exception is if a student is absent from school due to illness/injury and the school has been advised.)

If a booking is **not** made and maximum numbers have been reached, you may be called to call in and pick your child up.

Failure to advise the School of an absence will incur a charge.
