Practice the many skills associated with the traditional art of Maori flax weaving whilst gaining confidence in Tikanga Maori.

Throughout the day you will learn:

- Karakia (learn Maori prayer)
- How to identify harakeke for weaving and the process of preparation / storage
- Safe practices of cutting flax (harakeke)
- Learn basic Te Reo around weaving
- Take home your creations of flowers (putiputi) and a basket (koro)
