I am PROUD!



Structured Literacy The Spelling Process

As part of our Structured Literacy Spelling lessons students will decode - encode - decode. This means they read a word, write it and then read what has been written. This process helps lock the word into long term memory. The students follow this process for sounds, words and at sentence level. This process starts in the junior school and goes right through to the senior school. The words and sentences just become more complicated as the children progress through the school.
