Warm greetings to you all. It is hard to believe that we have arrived at the last week of Term 1 2024, it honestly feels like we just started! The term has gone so fast, perhaps because everyday has been a busy one since we started back at school. Our learning focus has been around healthy eating, gathering knowledge around how we source, produce, cultivate and preserve food in our past and present. I hope you had the opportunity to see some of the learners' wonderful work during goal setting interviews.

A couple of weeks ago we had our goal setting interviews. Thank you to all our whānau who attended these. If you weren't able to make it, you can still make time to meet with your child's teacher. I am so proud to say we had 304 interviews booked in on the day.

These first interviews have informed you of the goals your child has made in numeracy and literacy. They will be working on these goals for the next few weeks. Each term our teachers and your children will be meeting with you to report on how the goals are going; if they have reached these goals, what are the next learning goals and what they need to do to achieve them..... And yes your input and support is so vital to the whole goal setting and learning process. Our goals not only enable us to report to you progress and achievement, it is another opportunity for our learning partnerships with whānau to develop - this a very effective way of supporting your child in their learning. It would be great to see our whānau engaging more and more each time - let's see if we can beat 304 interviews next time!

This term we say goodbye to two of our staff; Jenny Angell who has been at our school for 7 years as a classroom teacher, and Miss Kay who has worn many hats in her TA role for the past 15 years. We thank them with full hearts for their contributions to our school community and wish them all the best in their next journeys.

Please whānau continue to read our newsletters and keep an eye out for all the main dates in Term 2 especially events that involve you as we would love to continue to connect and work with you. Also you are welcome to join us every 2nd Friday at 2pm for our whole school assemblies, where we come together as a whole school to share and acknowledge our learners, and the singing is really good too! Nau mai haere mai! Come along if you can.
