# **ANZAC Day Service**

Mrs Wells spoke beautifully about past school students who now appear on our WW2 honour roll. The girls read their names to the gathered crowd of several hundred at the Memorial Gates at Waltham Pool.



# **School Reports**

One of the themes that came through in feedback from the recent community survey was a desire to have a clearer picture of where students are sitting in terms of achievement against the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC). In response to this, senior staff have reviewed and redesigned our mid year school report. The big change in this trial is the addition of curriculum levels and an overall teacher judgement (OTJ) represented by a tick. The general comment has been removed as whānau have a parent / teacher interview directly after reports have been completed and sent home. The general comment will remain in the end of year report. As in previous reporting rounds, a Habits of Mind report is also included.

Each level of the NZC has been divided into B (beginning), P (proficient) and A (advanced). The coloured boxes indicate the range that we would expect students to be achieving within for their age. The tick indicates where the student is achieving according to an overall teacher judgement. Many factors are considered when staff make these judgements including standardized test results, achievements in class and the day to day observations teachers make of students at work. It should also be noted that there are many skills for students to master within each curriculum area and it is common for students to experience asynchronous growth. For example, in maths a student may be outstanding at addition and subtraction, but not yet have mastery of times tables.

Students work through the levels described in the NZC at different rates achieving milestones at different times. Generally, a student can spend two years of school working through one curriculum level. Progress in students is not linear and can feature rapid growth as well as plateaus at times. No two students are identical in terms of progress and achievement.
