BUT WHAT WE ARE REALLY LEARNING

IS...

"Habits of Mind are dispositions or thinking behaviors that are desirable attributes for learning and living productively in a complex world. People often use these habits when confronted with problems and situations to which the answers are not immediately apparent."

In lessons we always identify learning outcomes with students. "We are learning to" is recorded on a board with the skills or ideas attached. At St Mark's we add an extra layer by saying, "but what we are really learning is..." at which point we identify the associated HOM. Students used sometimes ask about the relevance of particular lessons or skills. They now understand that the knowledge or skills they are studying are a way to access deeper thinking skills that they can apply to a multitude of real life problems.
