
Mid Year Reports

The tick reflects an overall teacher judgement of where the **student is achieving now**, six months prior to the end of year.

In the example above, the student is achieving at the upper end of expectations mid way through 2024. This indicates strong progress.

In the example at the left, you can see that the student is working towards the expected level in Maths. He has another six months at school to make progress towards meeting the expected level.

In Reading, he is achieving strongly and in Writing, he is achieving within the expected already, six months before the end of the year.

Uniform requirements at St Mark's School

Enrolled children at St Mark's School are required to wear the compulsory uniform. The uniform provides the students with a sense of pride and school identification in the community.

Make-up, nail polish and coloured hair are not permitted. It is a safety requirement that hair (regardless of gender) extending below the collar is tied back with hair ties in school colours or matching natural hair colour. Students should have a neat and reasonable hairstyle (natural hair

Jewellery is not permitted to be worn, with the exception of plain stud earrings, watches and jewellery of a religious or cultural significance. Smart watches capable of texts or calls are not permitted.

For girls who opt for a dress or kilt instead of skorts, black bike pants or PE shorts can be worn. underneath for modesty.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Any requests that differ from what is outlined should first be discussed with the school Principal before further consultation with the Board of Proprietors.

- Join one of the four official walking routes, or make your own way to school. (Maps to follow).
- Students walking can wear mufti and may remain in this for the rest of the day. Please ensure they wear appropriate clothing including comfortable walking shoes. Thermals, jacket, hat and gloves may be required.
- Students may wish to carry a light bag for the walk if an adult is able to drop their school bag to school for when they arrive.
- It is recommended that walkers take a drink bottle, snacks and any personal medication (i.e. asthma inhaler), head torch and rain jacket on the walk.
- Walk will go ahead in light rain, however, if extreme weather is forecasted St Mark's School will communicate postponement details.
- Pack extra food in your child's lunch box, as they might be very hungry.
- A safety briefing will be given by event coordinators before the walk begins.
- One parent per five children needed. Adults will be allocated to students for supervision on the walk until arriving at school grounds. Adults required at front and back of walking groups and to ensure safety at all road crossings. High visibility clothing recommended if available.
- Arrive at school by 8.30 am and celebrate with a hot drink provided by the wonderful Parents Association.
- An official group photo will be taken before starting the school day.
- Smile, knowing you are making a huge and lasting difference in the lives of children and vulnerable women in need.
