Principal's Korero

Kia ora koutou whānau and welcome to our Pānui.

I am so proud to be the Principal of Geraldine Primary School. It is an incredible privilege to be able to interact with our Tamariki in a positive and fun way. Playing at break times and walking through classrooms are my daily highlights and I am lucky to see what the children are learning, how they learn, and to be part of the very well planned and resourced lessons. I know that we have such passionate and conscientious Kaiako at GPS. I am a huge believer in a strengths-based approach. Therefore, when I talk to the children, I am looking to build positive relationships and I always try and find out what they are good at first, this is essential to help build self-esteem and mutual respect. I am also using the terms, red, orange and green brain when I see disagreements or dysregulation. This is really helping the children to understand themselves and build empathy towards others. Presently, we are working on building a school wide framework/programme that will teach our children about our emotions, regulation, the brain, Te Whare Tapa Whā and incorporate our School PB4L values.

The last fortnight has been full of lots of great opportunities and experiences.

Last week we held book week: Belinda from Page & Post Booksellers came in to read to each syndicate in the library. Peter Hill - author of the 'Dad and me' books came in to read and talk to each syndicate in the library. Peter also held a reluctant writer's workshop. Friday, we had Book Character Dress Up Day and Parade; Literacy Quiz questions each day on notices; Book Emoji Pictionary; Scavenger Hunt in Library; Bookmark Colouring Competition and an Extreme Reading Photographic competition. Thank you so much to our staff and in particular, Miss Bathgate, Mrs Wilson and Mrs Lovelock for their planning and organisation. Our amazing Home and School gave up their valued whānau time to organise, set up and run a Scholastics book fair during the week and weekends. Their mahi and your support has helped to raise over \$1500 towards new books in our library.

Well done to our Year 5 and Year 6 team of boys and girls cross country runners. We had some outstanding individual results with Lachie Trevathan and Krystal Courage achieving first place and Pheobe Buchanan finishing 4th. I was so impressed with the nature and spirit in which all our runners competed. Each of them never gave up and kept pushing themselves to the very end. Their team spirit shone through with our Year 5 Girls finishing 2nd overall and our Year 6 Girls finishing 3rd overall.

During our student council meetings, we discussed what changes we would like to see at GPS. They came up with lots of ideas. The Council then got the chance to vote on our three most preferred options. Their top 3 were:

- 1. Pet day for Year 4 upwards teddy day for year 3 down
- 2. Pyjama day
- 3. Have two soccer goals

The council reps then took these options to classes, and everyone had a chance to vote on their preferred option. This week the Student Council spent the meeting counting the votes. 45% of the school voted for Pet Day for Year 4 upwards - Teddy Day for Year 3 down. Our next job will be to work as a team to make this a reality. Watch this space.

Our aim as a school is to provide excellent and up to date resources and classrooms that are modern, warm, inviting and engaging. Yesterday, we received our first Smart Board. In essence this is a large iPad. It is interactive and allows children to be actively involved with their learning. We have placed this in Room 8 and Mrs Smith is learning how to best use its full capabilities. Excitingly, we have just had plans approved for a complete internal and external refurbishment of rooms 4 and 5. This large body of work will start on July 8th and go through until the end of Term 4. I will be sending through more information on the logistics, health and safety and drawings of what this space will look like. I would like to thank our School Board for supporting this refurbishment and trialling new technology. We are very lucky.

At the end of this term, you will be receiving your child's mid-year report. Please contact your child's classroom teacher if you would like to discuss any of the content.
