Principal's News

I hope that you had a wonderful break. I would like to reach out and acknowledge the few people in our school whanau that have faced tough challenges over the holidays. We have loved catching up with all of our school children. It's amazing how fast they grow up over the long holidays! There has definitely been a lot of hugs, smiles and overall excitement flowing through our school over the last couple of days. Our staff are all looking forward to reconnecting and settling back in for another school year.

Staffing Changes: Due to a change in circumstances Eden Ripo will no longer be teaching in Room 1. However, we are delighted to announce the return of Kepa Grindlay 'Mr G' to our school whanau. We all missed him immensely so it's very warming to have him back with us all!

Government's 100-day and Priority Education Initiatives: As some of you would have seen, the government has set out a list of priorities that they want to achieve as part of their 100-day plan. The key changes in education so far are:

- 'Phones Away for the Day' Schools are required to put rules in place to ensure that this takes place. We already have
 an effective system in place for this with children being required to hand their phones into their teacher in the morning,
 and collecting them at the end of the school day. However, we are still required to work through the following timeline
 for this priority:
 - Term 1 2024 schools | kura revise or develop and consult with communities on how the rules will work and implement rules.
 - 29 April 2024 rules must be in place by this date (first day of Term 2).
 - Term 2 2024 ERO will begin monitoring compliance.
- 'One Hour a Day' Requirement -All schools are required to teach an hour of Reading, Writing and Maths each day.
 Once again, like many other schools in New Zealand we are already doing this.
- Attendance and Engagement also continues to be a priority as part of this initiative.

Important Information



Arriving & Leaving the School: Daily Drop offs, Pick Ups & Late Arrivals

. School opens for the day at 8.30am. This is the time that the school is unlocked and children are welcomed into their classrooms. Please don't send your children to school before 8.30am as staff are busy in the mornings with meetings or preparing their class for daily learning and are not available to supervise children who turn up earlier than 8.30am.

To ensure we're following best safety practices please note that...

- We need to change attendance if a student arrives late. If your child arrives at school after 9.00am please get them to come to the office so their attendance can be updated.
- School finishes for the day at 3.00pm. If you're collecting your children before 3.00pm or taking them out of school for an appointment during the school day, you need to sign them out at the office.
- If your child is going to be picked up by someone other than their usual parent, sibling or regular caregiver please phone ahead to the office to authorise this.

Note for Junior Learning Hub Parents & Caregivers

- To ensure our youngest students are kept safe children in the JLH must be picked up from the classroom by their parent or caregiver, or an older sibling. This ensures our littlies will be safe when negotiating the carpark or making their way home
- Parents are asked to arrive close to 3pm and wait on the JLH deck until class is finished for the day For best safety practice we strongly recommend all 5 year old's are collected from the classroom. If your child is older (6 years+) and you want them to leave the JLH by themselves to walk home or go out to the carpark to meet you please bring in a signed note so we have your request in writing.

Other information you need to know...

Skool Loop App: Please download this app as it is one of our main communication tools.

You can use it to advise us of absences, complete online permission slips or book your Hopes & Dreams (Parent-Student-Teacher) Interview times. Our newsletters are also available to view on this app and you'll receive a push notification for any important notices we're putting out.

Uniform: As always, it's expected that all children are in the correct school uniform each day. This is a school uniform top with plain black shorts, pants (not jeans), leggings or skirt.

Sunhats: It is school policy that children wear brimmed hats (not caps) in Terms 1 and 4 during break times and outdoor activities. Please ensure that your child has a hat to wear and brings it to school daily.
