


ALL BLACKS DAY THIS FRIDAY - 27 October

Update from the Limited Statutory Manager for the Manaia School Board

Over the last two weeks I have been made to feel very welcome at Manaia School. I have met individually with all staff, board and community members and looked through all relevant documentation. I now look forward to getting into classrooms and chatting with tamariki.

In two weeks, I will share my investigative findings with the Ministry, then the Board, and a plan will be set in place to address any areas of concern, should these arise.

Board By-Election:

The top priority is to appoint additional members to the Board as we have 3 parent elected vacancies. Nominations close on November 8th at noon. Please consider how your voice can add to the whole as we take Manaia School into the future.

Please view the webinar on our school facebook page to see what is involved in being a Board member, we need you.

Once Board appointments are made the Board will become very busy listening to whanau and wider community voice as they steer the school into the future. This consultation will ensure that we will meet the Ministry's new School Planning and Reporting Requirements which are due to be submitted by 1st March 2024.

Term 4 is a busy time in the school's calendar - Manaia School is no exception. Alongside student testing, reporting, end of year and sporting events, we will be focusing on next year's direction.

Staffing:

We are about to place two advertisements in the Education Gazette for teachers for 2024 and beyond.

We also have a recent resignation from Dianne (Di) Ngere (Teacher Aide) who is leaving for personal reasons. This position will be advertised in the South Taranaki Star. We thank Di for her support and work undertaken at the school and wish her the best going forward.

Staffing in schools across New Zealand has been challenging and I thank Manaia School teachers for their total commitment to the students in their care.

Alongside vacancies, staff also succumb to health issues which make it incredibly difficult in juggling positions to ensure students have trained teachers in front of classes.

At Manaia School we have two experienced Learning Assistants who both hold "Limited Authority to Teach" certification, and on occasion can be used if required to fill daily relief positions.

Senior management does a fabulous job in ensuring just this.

Tomorrow I meet with members of the community and then I take leave for a week, returning again on November 6th. I look forward to continuing my relationship with the school.
