Keeping our Young People Safe Online | We've Got This!

Life online and offline for young people is a seamless experience, however, the safety of children and young people has not been at the forefront in the design of many of the spaces and sites they enjoy and engage in. The role of whānau is vital, and makes the greatest difference in how young people learn about what's needed to be safe, and how to navigate the online space.

Anjie Webster from Generation Online will be sharing information about:

- the online landscape for our young people in Aotearoa and the opportunities, challenges and risks our young people face
- the Harmful Digital Communications Act and why this is important
- what we can do to support | positive, pragmatic ideas
- who can support us further

From national research and experience as an Education Advisor, Anjie provides insightful information, pragmatic approaches and easy wins for whānau, with the focus on a positive outlook in raising caring, capable and confident young citizens, online and offline.

Anjie Webster comes from an education background, and completed her M.Ed (Hons) with a research focus on digital technologies and online spaces, and the navigation for young people around challenges and risks. She partners with Netsafe, and is also a Ministry of Education facilitator, working in schools and kura around Aotearoa.

The talk will cover.

- Cyberbullying How bullies can reach our kids 24/7

- Gaming and the developing brain An oversupply of dopamine leading to dopamine deficiency, synaptic
 pruning, and the underdevelopment of social skills and empathy

- Naked Selfies The pressure to send nudes from intermediate up through high school
- Online predators The methods they use, how to spot them.
- Online porn vs healthy sexuality How consuming online pornography as a child or teen can create a sexual template where violence, aggression, and dominance are seen as normal and consent can become very blurry
