Te Horo School Out of Zone Enrolment Places Term 2 2024

The Board has determined that 5 new entrant places are likely to be available for Year 0 -1, for out-of-zone students for Term 2 2024.

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

For students seeking enrolment within Term 2 2024, the deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is noon on Friday 8th of March. Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the next year should notify the school to assist the school to continue to plan appropriately.

Ballot forms are available from the school office office@th.school.nz or call 06 364 3071.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students

will be selected by ballot. If a ballot for out-of-zone places is required for a Term 1 2024 start, it will be held on Monday 11th of March 2024. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

- Challenging our own phone and device usage Reconnecting as a family.


Here is a promotional video for you to watch Our Kids Online Parent Evening.
