Being Safe Digital Citizens

- Will think before they post, always respecting themselves and others when communicating (talking) online.
- Uses privacy settings and strong passwords to keep their personal information safe and private.
- Visits safe and trusted websites when taking part in online activities.
- Creates healthy habits by limiting the amount of time they spend online.
- Tells a trusted adult if they see someone being unkind online.
